Doxycycline Postexposure Prophylaxis (PEP) to Prevent Bacterial Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs)

Key Points and Recommendations:

- 1. Review and implement CDC's new <u>Clinical Guidelines on the Use of Doxycycline Postexposure</u> Prophylaxis for Bacterial Sexually Transmitted Infection Prevention:
 - Discuss the risks and benefits of doxycycline PEP with gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men (MSM) and transgender women (TGW), who have a history of at least one bacterial STI (i.e., chlamydia, gonorrhea, syphilis) during the past 12 months
 - Prescribe doxycycline PEP (using shared decision-making) so that your patient has sufficient supply in order to take a single 200 mg oral dose as soon as possible but within 72 hours after oral, vaginal, or anal sex (maximum dose of 200 mg every 24 hours)
 - Assess the need for doxycycline PEP every 3-6 months
 - Routinely screen for STIs, including testing for chlamydia and gonorrhea at anatomic sites
 of exposure (e.g., oropharyngeal, vaginal, urogenital, rectal), syphilis, and HIV at baseline
 and every 3-6 months
 - Consider prescribing or referring your patient for HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) therapy, for eligible patients who are HIV-negative
 - Recommend the <u>JYNNEOS vaccine for mpox prevention</u> to eligible patients who have not already completed the 2-dose series
 - Provide other routine preventive care services summarized in the MMWR publication, including sexual health and STI prevention counselling, vaccination, and other infectious disease screening (e.g., hepatitis B and C virus infection)
