Dear Senator Morse and Representative Packard:

In accordance with RSA 186-C:25, VII, the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) is providing this annual report on the Medicaid to Schools (MTS) program.

Table 1 depicts federal reimbursement dispersed and students served since the Division of Medicaid Services assumed responsibility for managing the MTS program.



Described below are matters which uniquely affected operation of the MTS program in SFY21:

- School Districts continue to struggle with obtaining qualified treatment provider orders for all medical services contained in a student's IEP/ Section 504 plan/individual health care plan. Federal regulations require that orders must be obtained before medical services can be billed to Medicaid. This has resulted in delays in School Districts submitting claims for medical services in a timely fashion.
- The Covid-19 pandemic resulted in school closures in March 2020. The pivot to remote learning has allowed School Districts flexibility in offering medical services via telehealth. Early adopters were thirty (30) School Districts who submitted claims. The chart below shows telehealth services paid from January 1 to June 30, 2020. A total of 503 students were served via telehealth. The Department will continue to monitor the use of telehealth in the school setting and provide utilization data in future updates.

- The continued global coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic has resulted in a growing need for Medicaid coverage and services in the school setting which significantly affects state and local school budgets. In response to increased demand for Medicaid, the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) provides all states and territories with a 6.2 percentage-point increase in Medicaid's federal medical assistance percentage (FMAP). The FMAP increase applies to Medicaid to Schools claims paid on or after January 1, 2020, and has continued. Matching dollars paid to School Districts are as follows: for SFY 20 for the period 1/1/20 to 6/30/2020 the total is \$223,359. For the period 7/1/2020 to 3/31/2021 the total is \$511,098. The FMAP payment for 4/1/2021 to 6/30/2021 has yet to be processed due to claims lag. These additional matching dollars for billed services will extend through the last day of the quarter in which the federal public health emergency (PHE) ends. The PHE is not anticipated to end earlier than January 2022, which would extend the funds availability for billed services through March 31, 2022.
- The Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Education continued its participation in Healthy Students Promising Futures, a learning collaborative for State Medicaid programs,
- The Medicaid to Schools fee schedule was updated to include the 3.1% rate increase in both January of 2020 and January of 2021 as approved by the NH Legislature. School Districts requested the Department compile these rates into one document for ease of use eliminating the need for look up on the NH MMIS website. Updated billing codes and fee for schedule were published in September 2021 for use during the 2021-2022 school year,
- Passage of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 provides for a temporary 10% increase in the federal medical assistance percentage (FMAP) for home and community based services (HCBS). States may craft a plan for use of the 10% FMAP increase. These plans must be approved by CMS prior to claiming and expenditure of the increased FMAP. New Hampshire's HCBS plan includes qualifying school based services. Upon CMS approval, as well as approval from the relevant legislative and executive bodies, schools will receive the enhanced 10% FMAP on qualifying HCBS services provided in the school setting.

- The Department in partnership with the Medicaid Fiscal Agent Conduent conducted three
   (3) learning sessions via Zoom to assist School Districts with the Medicaid provider enrollment and application process.
- The NH Charitable Foundation in collaboration with the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Education funded JSI Research and Training Institute/Community Health Institute (JSI/CHI) to develop a training and technical assistance center for NH School Districts to support utilization of the NH Medicaid to Schools program. Specifically JSI will support Medicaid enrolled school districts with administration and billing of medical services by providing timely responses to questions and providing tools to aid with billing. Individualized consultation to schools is available upon request.
- The Department engaged the services of the Institute of Health Policy and Practice at the University of New Hampshire to compile a technical assistance guide for use by School Districts. The Technical Assistance guide is a compilation of all the informational bulletins, provider notices and other communication that had been published since August 2019 including the administrative rules so as to have one source document for reference. The Technical Assistance Guide is in its final review and will be published in December 2021. Additionally a companion billing manual is being completed with billing instructions.

The Department continues to work with the Department of Education (DOE) and stakeholders throughout New Hampshire to make adjustments to the Medicaid to Schools' Program. The Department hosted three (3) stakeholder meetings via Zoom , issued seven (7) informational bulletins and six (6) provider notices all of which are posted on the Department's website to assist School Districts with implementation of the Medicaid to Schools benefit. The Department continues to explore a potentially more advantageous method in how schools are covering their costs and receiving Medicaid reimbursement. Under evaluation is use of administrative and direct service claiming. This methodology would allow schools to bill for both direct medical services and associated administrative costs. The Department continues to explore this option and will provide additional information in future updates.

A list of the School Districts and/or School Administrative Units (n=171) enrolled as Medicaid providers during this period is enclosed. Currently only six (6) School Districts/SAUs do not participate in Medicaid to Schools.
